SPEAKERS' BIOGRAPHIC NOTES

João Gomes Cravinho is Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs and Cooperation of Portugal. He graduated and did his MSc at the London School of Economics and holds a PhD from Oxford University. He has served as Assistant Professor at the Faculty of Economy, Coimbra University, teaching International Relations and coordinating the doctoral program *International Politics and Conflict Resolution*. He was also guest lecturer at ISCTE and Universidade Nova de Lisboa.

Mr. Cravinho's doctoral dissertation focused on Mozambique, and he has published extensively in Portuguese and foreign journals – United Kingdom, France and Spain. Besides several articles in specialized journals, his most important publication in the area of International Relations is “Visões do Mundo” published in 2002 and written mainly while Visiting Researcher at Georgetown University, in Washington.

In addition to his academic career, Mr. Cravinho has devoted several years of his activity to the area of Development Cooperation. In 1999 he coordinated the inter-ministerial report of the Portuguese Government concerning assistance to East Timor; in 2000 he worked with the Portuguese presidency of the European Union and from January 2001 to June 2002 he was president of the Institute for Portuguese Cooperation. Among other activities he has been consultant in national (Fundação Calouste Gulbenkian) and international (European Commission and World Bank) institutions.

José Manuel BRIOSA E GALA is the Personal Representative of the European Commission President and Special Advisor for Africa. In this context, he notably takes part into the Africa Partnership Forum dialogue process and the Africa Personal representatives meetings, a G8 related process.

Mr. Briosa e Gala has served as Portugal Secretary of State for Development Cooperation from 1992 till 1995. He previously served as a Deputy Secretary of State for the Portuguese Minister of Education in 1991. He then was appointed in July of 2003, as personal representative of the Portuguese Prime Minister José Manuel Durão Barroso, for the Africa Partnership Forum (APF), a position he left in 2005 upon the nomination of Mr. Durão Barroso as President of the EC.

A lawyer and legal adviser, he also holds master degrees in Management and International Relations.

In addition to his public office experience, Mr. Briosa e Gala has an extensive experience in the private sector, specifically in the telecom area. He hold the following position from 1998 to present: Executive Board Member of Portugal Telecom Multimedia, 2003-2006; CEO PT Conteúdos, 2003-2006; PCA and vice-PCA Sporttv, 2003-2006; Board Member of SIC Notícias, 2003-2006; Executive Director of Portugal Telecom Móveis, 2002-2003; Executive Director of Portugal Telecom International, 1998-2002, and its affiliated in the following countries: Cabo Verde, Guiné-Bissau, São Tomé e Príncipe, Angola, Mozambique and Macau; Executive Director of TLP (Lisbon and Oporto Telephones) and member of the Board of consultants of Instituto de Comunicações de Portugal, 1992).

Markwick Khumalo is a member of Pan African Parliament from Swaziland and the Chairperson of the PanAfrican Parliament (PAP) Joint Delegation for Relations with the European Parliament.

Andrew Sherriff is Senior Programme Officer for the Development Policy and International Relations (DPIR) programme at the European Centre for Development Policy Management (ECDPM) where he focuses on the Joint-Africa-EU Strategy amongst other issues. ECDPM is an independent foundation that has worked on EU-Africa, Caribbean and Pacific relations since 1986. Prior to joining ECDPM Andrew worked as an adviser and consultant on policy issues to the Slovenian EU Presidency, UK Foreign and Commonwealth Office, DFID, Austrian Development Agency, Belgium DGDC, and a variety of NGOs and think tanks (Oxfam International, Saferworld, World Vision, SNV). From 1999 to 2004 Andrew worked at International Alert, one of the leading organizations in the field of peace building where he managed work on the European Union and conflict sensitive development. He has lived and worked in East and Central Africa and the Balkans region. Originally from Scotland, Andrew has a BA in International Relations from Staffordshire University, an MA in International Studies from the University of Limerick in Ireland. He is also an Adjunct Professor at American University in Washington D.C., USA.
